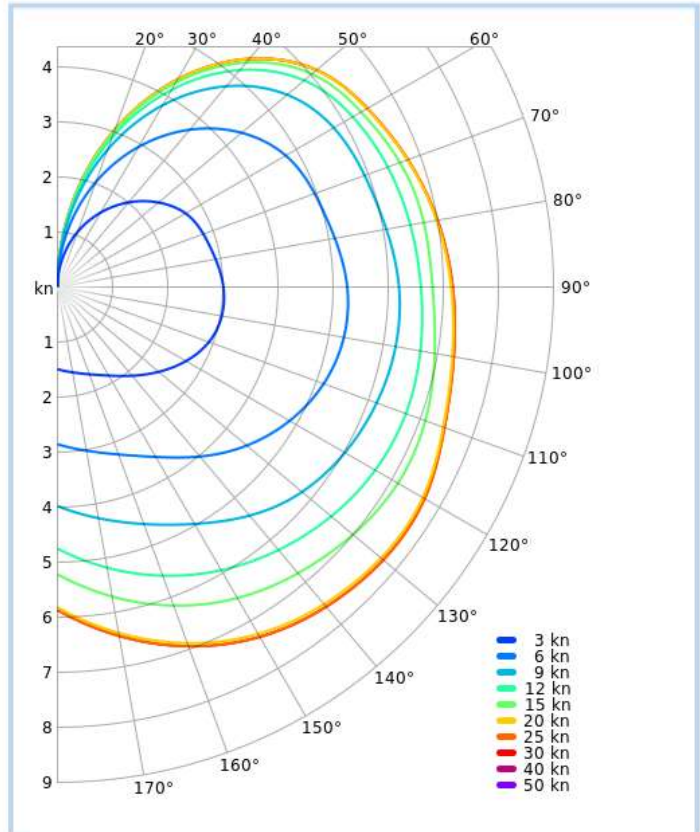

Back in the early 1970s, a herd of young naval architects including later legends like Ron Holland, Ed Dubois, Bruce Farr and Jean-Marie Finot cut their teeth on 1/4 Tonners. Amongst them was also Sweden's late Peter Norlin, who unusually not only designed them, but raced them himself, and the Scampi 26 is the production version of the yacht he helmed into P2 in La Rochelle in 1972, behind the Finot Petite Fleur design. Having already won the 1/2 Ton three years (69-71) in a row with the 26's older 30ft sister, two years later, Norlin also won the 1/4 Ton title, sailing Accent, an iteration on the Scampi 26.

Introduced into the SOL boathouse 36 years after hitting the water IRL, we still take this old lady out for a spin from time-to-time, although IRL she is a little too venerable to feature in rejuvenated 1/4 Ton Cups held annually in these old-timers.
